## **Registration Form and Digital Image Requirements**

The West Virginia Division of Culture and History uses the National Information System Project (NISP) of the National Assembly of State Arts Agencies.

# **Digital Image Submissions**

Send six (6) professional, high resolution digital images of your current work, on a CD to:

1. Label each image with the artist's last name, plus a number

Example: "jones1.jpg"

- 2. The file should be either 8 bit TIFF file (approximately 3.5 MB) or a high quality JPEG file (at least 150 KB file size). NO OTHER FILE FORMAT IS ACCEPTABLE
- 3. A text document containing slide information as it pertains to the digital images must be included. That text should include: a. Artist's Name
- b. Title of Work
- c. Medium
- d. Size of Work
- e. Date of Completion
- 4. Represent your art or craftwork with the best possible images.
- 5. Plan to update your images and information every two years.

Here are some suggestions for producing top quality digital images to represent you:

- 1. If possible, have a professional photographer to take the photos of your art or craftwork
- 2. If you take the pictures yourself, be sure that a. The work fills the image area as much as possible
- b. Format images for a screen of 1280 pixels across by 1024 pixels high
- c. The image can be "framed" by adding a black box around the artwork in the image, but the artwork itself cannot be digitally altered.
- d. Photograph your work outdoors in an evenly lighted area, NOT IN DIRECT SUNLIGHT
